Sunday, May 29 **Guest Speaker:** Rev. Dr. Emlyn Ott Do you remember the moment you met Jesus? I don't mean the moment you first went to youth group or Sunday School or your first revival meeting. I'm not talking about the first Bible Study you remember attending or the church dinner where you realized that carry-ins are the best.

I am asking you if you remember the moment when Jesus changed your life forever? If your answer is yes, have you ever shared that life changing moment with others? The book of John records the meeting of Simon Peter and

The introduction happens thanks to Simon Peter's brother, Andrew. In the first chapter of John it is recorded that ...

#### "Looking intently at Simon, Jesus said, "Your name is Simon, son of John- but you will be called Cephas" (which means "Peter").

I cannot imagine what that moment was like for Simon Peter. His brother had come to him and told him that "We have found the Messiah" (John 1:41). When Peter went with Andrew to meet Jesus, I would think that it would be Peter who would be "looking intently" at Jesus to see if this guy was really who his brother said he was. Did he "look" Messiah-like? Did he talk like, move like, think like, act like the Messiah should? As Jesus often does, however, he turned the tables on Simon Peter. Instead of being the one examined, he is the one checking out Peter. Can you even imagine what it would feel like to have Jesus look at you "intently?" What is it like to have the eyes of your Savior peering into yours? Did Simon feel like Jesus was looking straight into his soul? Did he feel vulnerable, exposed, "seen?" Did Simon's life flash before Jesus' eyes? I have so many questions! Whatever that moment between Jesus and Simon was like, it was a life changing one for Simon. changing one for Simon - a life changing moment that started with a name change. It reminds me of when a couple gets married ... we change our last name to show a shift in who we used to be to who we have now become. We were a single person who belonged to our family of birth. Now, as a married person, our name changed to show we now are chosen and belong with our spouse. We have become one with that person. We have, in the eyes of God, an inseparable bond. I think that is the kind of moment Jesus and Simon had here. Jesus looks him in the face and says, "You used to be yours, but now you are mine!" Everything changes for Simon from that moment on. He was no longer His own. He had a connection to Jesus that was going to change him!

You see, that is what Jesus does. He looks us in the heart and calls us out. He says to us from the beginning that He will make us a new creation. He has the ability to see who we will become because of His great love – and the love of our Savior is a soul saving, heart changing, life altering love. It is a love that we are called to live in and to share. We don't get to decide who is worthy of that love. Christ tells us to "go and make disciples of all nations." That leaves out no one. It means EVERYONE is loved by God and He wants them to hear the Good News! That is why Jesus looked at Peter and changed his heart. Peter was called by Jesus to love others and spread the Gospel ... as are we, my friends! I know that we have not actually stood in the same room as Jesus and had him come over and look us square in the eyes. Yet ... the call of Jesus on our hearts is no less real than that of Peter's. Our passion and desire to serve, follow, love, and share Christ with the world we live in should be just as real also! May you

always find yourself looking intently into the heart of Jesus!

#### Dog Obedience Classes

Allan Bauman has been actively training dogs for over 39 years. He started his early career successfully competing in Obedience Competition. This developed into a career of Pet Care and Dog Training. He operated Goldenbrook Kennels for 18 years.

Allan is a Charter Member and Past President of the Association of Pet Dog Trainers. He currently serves on the Board of the APDT Foundation. He has lectured both Nationally and Internationally. Allan's book "Pawsitive" Dog Training achieved a recommended reading by Dogwise through its reader's polls. The video version of his book received a Top Video of the year through The Whole Dog Journal.

The class is a full training course. Non-participants will have the opportunity to watch a class in progress and learn techniques and skills that they can apply to their own dogs at home.







#### We Remember

More than 150 years ago, Memorial Day took shape amid the backdrop of the U.S. Civil War. Before it ended, women began decorating the graves of fallen soldiers. In 1868, when May 30 was designated as Decoration Day, loved ones placed flowers on the graves of Union Confederate soldiers

By 1882, Decoration Day became known as Memorial Day, and soldiers who died in other wars were honored too. Over time, it became a day to remember all loved ones who have died — in war and otherwise. In 1971, Congress declared Memorial Day a national holiday to be observed on the last Monday in May. On Memorial Day, we pause to remember people who made the ultimate sacrifice for their country and for our freedom. We also pray for those who continue serving, especially those in harm's way.

#### Recipe of the Month... from the kitchen of Martha Scaggs

Chicken/Turkey Tettrazini

1 onion, diced

1 stalk celery, diced

2 T. butter

2 cups chicken or turkey

1/2 c. spaghetti, broken into 2" pieces

1 can cream of chicken soup

1 can mushrooms

1 can chicken broth

1/2 c. grated Parmesan cheese




Sauté together onion and celery in butter. Add chicken/turkey, spaghetti, soup, mushrooms, broth, and Parmesan cheese. Simmer on low for 20 minutes. Stirring occasionally. Add more liquid if needed. I like to use fresh mushrooms. Chop mushrooms and sauté them with the onion and celery. You can also add a couple tablespoons pimento.
